


- Maintenance of the Cemetery grounds will be completed by the municipality from May to October.
- It is the employees' responsibility to ensure the appearance, improvements, care, and all maintenance including, mowing grass, trimming growth around the headstones, tree trimming, repairs to fencing, gates, buildings, etc. are attended to.
- Employees are authorized to remove any broken material, excess growth or other items that are prohibited or may cause a hazard to staff and visitors.



Alexander Cemetery

The Alexander Cemetery is owned by the Rural Municipality of Whitehead; it is situated north of the village (NE17-10-21W) and is open to the public 7 days a week from sun-up to sun-down.

- Permission must be obtained before burial or items permanently placed at a gravesite.
- No person shall injure or damage any tree or shrub, pick any flower (wild or cultivated)
- Vehicles shall be driven with care, restricted to the roadway and to a maximum speed of 20 km/hr. Off-road vehicles, ATV's, snowmobiles, etc. are not permitted.

Purchasing a plot & Perpetual Care:

 Plots are available to current and past residents of the RM of Whitehead. The cost of a plot is set out in the Annual Schedule of Fees By-law and included the perpetual care fee. A receipt and deed will be provided to the purchaser.

Headstones & Monuments:

- All must be constructed of durable material: bronze, granite, marble, stone and must have a minimum 3-inch margin from the edge of the base
- Options are: upright, flat, raised or none
- Permission is required before the installation of any headstone or monument
- The Municipality shall not assume liability or responsibility for the loss or damage to any monument or any part thereof.
- Grave covers (cement or plastic) are not permitted.

Interments/Burials:

- Burials are limited to human remains
- Four burials will be permitted in one plot:
- 2 caskets and 2 urns;
- 1 casket and 3 urns;
- 4 urns (maximum);
- Other combinations as approved by Administration


Family Responsibility:

- Maintenance, repair, and replacement of headstone
- No person shall place glass objects, potted or artificial flowers or plants, solar lights, toys, trinkets, keepsakes, apparel, posters or signage, vases, or ornaments on a gravesite.

Spring & Fall Clean-up:

- Spring clean-up will commence during the months of May/June
- Fall clean-up commence in October
- All items not permitted will be removed and discarded
